Surburban Yard - the bird was present underneath a seed feeder but also spent time perching in a Rubus bramble and appeared to feed on some Ligustrum sinense seeds.

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation):

Bird spent a few minutes feeding on ground underneath a seed feeder, then flew to a nearby ligustrum bush to feed.

The bird was the approximate size of nearby northern cardinals. There were 2 faint white wing bars. The chest and belly area were a burnt orange color and no streaking on the breast was noticed. The back was streaked. Bill was large, conical shaped, white stripe over the eye and a dark cheek patch on the head. During flight, underwing coverts were noticed to be pale yellow.

- Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation):

Rose-breasted Grosbeak were eliminated by the pale yellow underwing coverts and no streaking on the orange breast.
