9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light):

Mostly clear sky with optimal mid-afternoon sunlight. Sun angle fairly high. Backlighting or glare not problematic.

10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Zeiss Victory FL 8x42 (optics in good condition).

11. Distance to bird(s): within 20-30 meters

12. Duration of observation: ~10-15 min.

13. Habitat: Heavily disturbed early successional growth, unimproved cattle pasture, yaupon-elderberry-baccharis thickets, willow-hackberry-tallow scrub, brushy edges, fallow fields, cultivated ag. fields, freshwater coulee, borrow pits, dense tangles, brush, roadside scrub, rural residential, etc.

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation):

First observed actively fly-catching/ sallying down from utility lines and lower woody perches on south side of road. Observed in flight as it made brief forays out for prey, i.e. aerial arthropods, insects, etc. Never vocalized throughout observation.

15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species, body bulk, shape, proportions, bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species):

A relatively long-winged bluebird with almost entirely sky-blue plumage. Slightly duller blue on underparts. Some grayish on vent. Small, thin all-black bill. Dark irides. Black tarsi and feet.

16. Voice: Silent. Not applicable at time of observation.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Fairly distinctive bluebird with all-blue upperparts and blue wash to underparts, which eliminates other N.A. bluebirds.

Extremely familiar with this species from their normal range and distribution throughout the intermountain western U.S. and from one prior encounter in coastal southeast Louisiana.
