

Stakeout: already ticked by numerous observers previous day and last observed 11 April 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): **Good: overcast, 72 F, calm**

.10 X 42 and 10 X 50 Leica binoculars; good condition

11. Distance to bird(s): As close as 25-50 ft.

12. Duration of observation: approximately for 10 minutes – took a little while to find it searching Longwood Drive.

13. Habitat: Neighborhood, feeding on lawn and under ornamental vegetation. Photo below by SWC shows preferred habitat by yellow dumpster.

Foraging on the ground in the open and under leafy vegetation, bird also flew up on fence (behind yellow dumpster).

Obvious thrasher with long-curved dark bill, grayish-brown back, diffused grayish-brown spots on paler under parts, grayish-brown flanks, dark slightly graduated tail, white in tips of outer rectrices, no pale wingbars, yellow-orange eye, gray legs.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation):

Bendire's Thrasher is somewhat similar but has browner tone to plumage, different "gizz," including a shorter bill.

Yes, by DLD (others have much better photos)

DLD and SWC have previously seen a couple vagrants in CA, and hundreds of individuals in AZ and TX (also lots of similar Bendire's Thrasher).
