- 11. Distance to bird(s): birds observed on water and flying within 50 to 100 ft of boat
- 12. Duration of observation: multiple observations for several minutes at a time
- 13. Habitat: deep blue waters of Gulf near Sargassum line
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): birds feeding and resting on water and observed flying near boat over water surface
- 15.
