- 12. Duration of observation: very brief, probably 30 seconds

- 13. Habitat: backyard with elderberry, Baccharis, holly, hackberry, ragweed, lemon, satsuma, multiple Salvias, Cupheas, firespike, four o'clocks, roseglory barrow, etc.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation):. Bird was chased out of our water oak (or came through there) by our resident winter RTHU adult male (6 year returnee), into the neighbor's red maple behind us, where it began fussing with the RTHU, before going silent and disappearing altogether, apparently.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen*; include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): Dark silhouetted hummingbird flyover.being chased by RTHU into neighboring yard and disappearing.
- 16. Voice: Very similar to RCKI, but drier and more consistent "bursts", to my ears
- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): RCKI has a more "charged" chattering, in staggers often, body shape; kinglets are tiny as well. Hummingbirds have much faster wingbeats, in a crazy directional flight, LONG, thin bill, longer rectrices.
