Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was initially detected by voice; a sharper rendition of a Ruby-crowned Kinglet (Regulus calendula), then flew in and perched on an exposed twig in front of me.
