Bird was seen a year ago in nearly the same location. I searched, unsuccessfully, for it on Nov 22. It was found on the 23rd by Glenn Oussett. I went to the location and played a screech owl tape. After a few minutes, I heard the BDFL. I saw it shortly thereafter. It continued vocalizing after the owl tape was turned off. I flew about in the trees and perched often so that I was able to obtain photos. Also recorded it.
