10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Zeiss 10x42 binoculars, Swarovski telescope at 25-40x.

- 11. Distance to bird(s): about 120 ft at closest.
- 12. Duration of observation: approx. 5-8 min.

13. Habitat: bottomland woodland edge by ditch and road.

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): First spotted by Michele, after which, it flew over us, across road and ditch into denser vegetation, and eventually popped into open after playback of several different *Myiarchus* spp.

15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): Large *Myiarchus* with extensively rufous tail (clearly visible in flight). Huge bill, fairly saturated yellow below, pale gray throat. Olive brownish above. Rectrices with narrow dark outer vanes that did not spread across tip of feathers. Based on bill size, we are certain this is subspecies *magister*.

16. Voice: None heard, despite extensive playback.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Ashthroated smaller, smaller billed, and less saturated yellow or gray on underparts. Dark outer vane of rectrices crosses tip. Great Crested usually much more deeply saturated yellow and gray on underparts. Bill not so large, and has more obvious flesh-colored base.
