White head with dark spot behind the eye and dark half collar to nape. Eye dark. Lesser/Median coverts dark with grayish mantle. Chest and belly white. Primaries dark. Bill and legs appeared dark.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Red-legged kittiwake: has a darker mantle and lacks the dark wing coverts. Immature Black-headed, Bonaparte's and Little Gulls all have dark spots behind the eye but lack the dark half collar.
