- 4. Date(s) when observed: 3-16-18
- 5. Time(s) of day when observed: 2:55 thru 3:10 pm. Still there when we left.

- 7. Other observers accompanying reporter who also identified the bird(s): Malise Prieto
- 8. Other observers who independently identified the bird(s): We were the first to see it. On the 17<sup>th</sup>, seen by Joan Garvey, Cathy DiSalvo, Mike Munier and Philip DiSalvo
- 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Overcast with some break in clouds to show blue sky.
- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Steiner 8x42 and Lumix F28 25-600mm
- 11. Distance to bird(s): between 15 to 25 feet
- 12. Duration of observation: about 15 minutes
- 13. Habitat: Boat harbor and fish cleaning station next to marsh and open water.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was calm. Mixed in with LAGU and RBGU dipping down to take fish pieces being thrown in the water from the cleaning station. It flew around the harbor several times and would come back to the cleaning station to try for more food. Several people were there coming in

from fishing and the bird was not timid or afraid.

It stood out from the LAGU by it's larger size, white based tail with black edging and smudge on it's face behind the eye. When it landed, I could see the thick, black nape collar. When it flew down to the water, I could see the bold black M pattern on the upperpart of wings.
