Typically shaped Sulid, brown, nearly uni-colored, but some contrast of breast with belly—in other words, showing a hint of the adult pattern. Base of underwing pale. Bill dark, bluish gray.

also brownish overall, apparently shows more contrast between upperparts and underparts, and an indistinct breast band, all dark underwing.
