Both birds black with white underneath, black lining around wings and neck and at least one had some speckling on chest. Noted a white face on one bird.

They were large birds (brown pelican size) that in turning flew similarly to Northern Gannets (vertically instead of horizontally like pelicans usually do) with pointy wings outstretched. No photos obtained as I was driving at the time.
