- 13. Habitat: Small suburban backyard habitat with three orange trees, pecan tree, holly, bottle brush tree, shrimp plants, bird baths, feeders, etc...
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): The bird was preening its feathers before it flew.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): Obvious black throat with distinct black lores and eyeline. Its crown had muted gray/dusky cap appearance, yellow supercilium, auriculars, breast, and tail. Back grey in color with white wing bars. The transition from its yellow breast to its white belly was fairly abrupt, not blended.
- 16. Voice: Not vocal.
- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): An adult male Baltimore Oriole has a completely black head and throat, bright orange breast, belly and vent. Female Baltimore Orioles lack the distinct black eyeline paired with a black bib and bright yellow supercilium and cheeks that first year male Bullock's Orioles possess.
