- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation):

 During the Grand Isle Migratory Bird Fest, Michael Seymour and I were running the banding station. Jane Patterson notified Michael of a Black-whiskered Vireo that she (and others) watched fly into a camper and was laying on the ground. It was near the Santiny property (edge of Grilletta) so Greg and I walked over to check on it. The bird was still on the ground, stunned but alert. I put the bird in a banding bag and brought it back to the station. We let it rest for 15 mins or so and checked its status. It was alert at that time so we banded the bird and it quickly flew away upon release.
- 15. Vireo with dingy face, two black whiskers. Superficially like a Red-eyed Vireo but without sharp contrast between the back and head, whiskers, longer bill, and overall drab appearance.

Red-eyed Vireo was eliminated by presence of black-whiskers, duller plumage, and larger, thinner bill.
