- 2. Number of individuals, sexes, ages, general plumage (e.g., 2 in alternate plumage): 1 (I may have heard another bird call but I could never be sure there was anything more than this one bird, which at one point flew 1/4 mile)
- 3. Parish: St. Tammany
- 4. Specific Locality: Fontainebleau State Park
- 5. Date(s) when observed: 2 Dec. 16
- 6. Time(s) of day when observed: 13: 00-14: 00

- 14. Habitat: Live oaks with adjacent scrubby woods, including lots of tallow, upon which the bird may have been feeding.
- 15. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Most time spent high in treetops sallying for aerial insects.
- 16. Description (include only what was actually seen, not what "should" have been seen; include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species, body bulk, shape, proportions, bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species): An obvious yellow-tyrannid with brownish tail lacking white anywhere; mostly yellow from breast to undertail coverts; bright greenish back; heavy bill. - 17. Voice: Occasional calls ("kep" -- vaguely reminiscent of Song Sparrow) and some bursts of burry, chortling song-like vocalizations (captured on video)
- 18. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Tropical is only species sharing these plumage features. Diagnostic vocalizations captured on video that eliminate TRKI and any other Tyrannus

- 20. Previous experience with this species: Not much -- this might be the best study I've ever had (and was much of the incentive to go there and spend time)
