- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Vortex HD 8x42 Diamondbacks new, Vortex HD 10x50 new, Nikon D40 (ca. 10 years) with 70-300mm telephoto lens (four years?)
- 11. Distance to bird(s): ca. 20ft. 150ft. (varying)

- 12. Duration of observation: ca. 30 minutes or so
- 13. Habitat: hardwood forest with surrounding shrubby undergrowth (west side of road) and second growth levee habitat with ragweed, willow, etc.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): bird was actively foraging; sallying out and catching crane flies, often coming down to the roadside and hawking the short grass.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): Yellow-bellied kingbird with yellow coming all the way up to the upper chest and becoming slightly greenish below throat. Gray head and back with dark wings and tail. Bill thicker and longer than in WEKI. No white outer tail feathers.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Tropical Kingbird voice, Western Kingbird voice, has white outer tail feathers and smaller bill, Cassin's Kingbird voice, smaller bill and whiter throat.
