Distinct dark head and bill, white throat and chest drew my attention to this bird. Went inside to get camera for documenting what appeared to be a flycatcher (determined by general shape of bird). Looking through viewfinder of camera was able to see the black forked tail. Noted another bird just to the left in the same tree. It flew closer to another tallow tree. Its forked tail was shorter and I reported it as an immature bird in my ebird report.
