Stress features that separate it from similar species): Very large gull, and larger than Herring Gulls and much larger than numerous Ring-billed Gulls. Virtually all white with exception of some subtle smudging of brown on wing coverts, axillaries, and face. Very large bicolored bill with dark tip and dark
iris age it as a first cycle immature. Bulky sloping head and large size also separate it from Iceland Gull.
