Stress features that separate it from similar species): posture and behavior indicated kingbird, but bulkier, larger headed and billed than Eastern Kingbird, paler gray without dark cap, dark band through eye, whitish throat, belly, undertail, no white band on the end of tail.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Not familiar with Thick-billed Kingbird but unlikely in this area, separated from Eastern Kingbird on the basis of bulkier body, larger head and bill, lighter gray coloration, no white edge on tail
