14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and

stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): First spotted as it flew in from landfill and alighted among other resting gulls. Eagles flushed the gulls several times, and it was lost after about 15 min of observation. DFL relocated the bird again around noon and watched it for another 25 min or so, getting further photos.

15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species, body bulk, shape, proportions, bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species): A large white-headed gull, slightly larger than the Ringbills, but slightly smaller than Herring around it. Noticeably whitish primaries. Bill mostly dark with paler base. Overall plumage was mottled cream and some patchy grayish or buff, no strong blackish on wings or body plumage. Bill was small for a large gull. Eyes dark, legs dull pink.

16. Voice: Not heard.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Glaucous Gull larger, clearly two-toned bill. Herring should have obvious blackish markings on primaries, tail, heavier build. No other gulls really so pale.
