8. Other observers who independently identified the bird(s): Initially found by Wanda and Michael Beelman on January 11, 2020. Also, numerous other observers reported this bird on previous dates.
9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Clear sky: excellent afternoon lighting.
10. Optics: Tom-10x42 Bushnell Binoculars and Sony DSC-H50 Digital Camera. Glenn-10x42 Zeiss Binoculars, 20-60x Kronus Scope, Panasonic Digital Camera. Reneé-Kowa Genesis 10x33 Binoculars and Panasonic LUMIX 10x Optical Zoom Digital Camera.
11. Distance to bird(s): Varied, from about 30 to 50 yards away.
12. Duration of observation: Off and on for about an hour and a half. Bird was diving constantly.
13. Habitat: Large freshwater pond, bordered by parking area, street and low brushy and grassy areas.
14. Behavior of bird/circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Swimming and diving underwater frequently.
15. Description (include only what was actually seen, <i>not what "should" have been seen;</i> include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species, body bulk, shape, proportions, bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species): About teal-sized duck (about 15"), lacking long tail. Prominent white face with dark spot on lower rear of face; dark bill, eye, cap (dark runs down back of neck) & back; white or light neck and below; wings dark with no visible pattern. The overall dark-and-white pattern of the entire bird not like any other species. Dark areas were dark brown or dark gray-brown, not black.
16. Voice: Silent or not audible at the distance from observers to duck.
17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): No resemblance to any other duck species.
18. Photographs or tape recordings obtained? (by whom? attached?): Photos by Tom (4), Glenn (2) & Reneé (2).

Previous experience with this species: Tom has previous experience with this species on two other occasions— Jefferson Parish (Bonnabel Boat Launch) on 2/25/2009 and St. Tammany Parish (Guste Island Road) on 3/10/2010. Glenn has previous experience with the species on a number of occasions. New bird for Reneé.
