Seen several times extremely briefly (no longer than 5 seconds a piece) throughout morning at Peveto

- 13. Habitat: Deciduous chenier understory/thickets
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation):

Giving chip note calls repeatedly, moving throughout Peveto (i.e near parking area, near pond, near trail that goes to beach). Always in thick vegetation, never seen for an extended period of time nor photographed (audio of chip notes was recorded). Not responsive at all to playback or mob tapes. Did not seem to be associating in any mixed flocks.

In flight: silhouette appearance of large headed, short tailed passerine that gave "top heavy" appearance.

Sitting: Gray-headed *Geothlypis*-type warbler with yellow underneath, greenish-yellow on top, black bib; white eye arcs

Mourning Warbler: eliminated via presence of white eye arcs (can probably also be eliminated by vocal recordings, but I cannot hear a difference between the two chip calls)
