9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Good light, except at first light of day the color of the back and head could not be seen well. When the sun rose more and the bird came down off of the wire to work the brush and small trees, its color was more obvious. See photos.

10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): 10x40 Zeiss Binocs and Nikon P-900

camera.

11. Distance to bird(s): Varied from 30 yards to 100 yards.

12. Duration of observation: 12/21/2020

13. Habitat: Fallow fields near small gulley.

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was resting on wires and then feeding around lower trees and brush.

The head and upper breast was a light sky blue in color lighter than the back. It had a slight narrow, white eye ring. No reddish on the breast or back could be seen. See photos.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): EABL or WEBL. No reddish was seen in breast or back. The color of blue was a lighter sky blue color as opposed to the heavy blue of the above two birds.
