- 3. Parish: St. Mary Parish Specific Locality: Cypremore Point State Park, just after entry area

9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Lighting was good, sun was to our back

10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Nikon Coolpix B600 and Nikon Prostaff 3S 10 x 42 binoculars

11. Distance to bird(s): From 10 feet to 100 feet, bird was not very skiddish We observed from inside the car driving slowly on the road while bird was on fence posts or fence wire. We also observed from outside of the car walking slowly around as the bird moved around.

12. Duration of observation: 15 minutes first time, then a couple other times over $1\frac{1}{2}$ hour period of just a few minutes each

13. Habitat: Adjacent to park road, open grassy area, grass was cut, and a few spotted trees. Fence posts with thick wire between posts. Lawn was damp with small spotty water puddles.

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was sitting, flying, feeding, hovering. Flit from one spot to another, mostly within a short distance from where we were.

It was the size of an Eastern Bluebird but the blue was more vibrant to me.
