13. Habitat: man-made levee surrounding old landfill, treeline bordering marsh, ponds, and canals

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): bird was actively flycatching from open snags; would sally down to ground and catch predominately large crane flies (Tipila sp.).

Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): washed-out female bluebird with thin, black bill, conspicuous white eyering, coming to a point behind the eye. Largely grayish upperparts with buffy throat and tones on breast, grayish belly, sky blue flight feathers and tail, gray back.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Eastern Bluebird by lack of white belly, lack of orange chest/sides, no stripe on throat, thinner bill. Western Bluebird is more similar to EABL, but with bluish throat, gray flanks.
