- 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Overcast, showers in area with light fog that lifted once we got on the water. The water was relatively calm, no shade preventing optimal views. Birds viewed by kayak.
- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Swarovski ATC 17-40x56 spotting scope (used before going on kayak from the pier and could see the birds in the fog faintly), Leica Trinovid 8x42 binoculars, photos with Canon 60D and Canon 400m 5.6 lens
- 11. Distance to bird(s): 10-35 meters

- 12. Duration of observation: 60 mins
- 13. Habitat: freshwater lake, reservoir
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): swimming, pair of grebes sticking together and would dive and disappear and pop up in other areas of the lake.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): large bodied with long neck, long yellow bill, dark head/cap contrasting with pale gray cheeks and long brownish-rufous neck. They remind me of Neapolitan ice cream with their three contrasting colors that separate their body parts.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): RNGR are large bodied and long necked, with contrasting plumage colors and a long yellow bill which rules out PBGR. RNGR larger than HOGR with darker plumage overall and yellow bill which rules out HOGR.
