

1 Details: Second rice field east of N. Adam's on Pecan Orchard. Black morph coming into breeding plumage. My view was through weeds on dike but JG obtained photos before it flew with a mixed flock. A tall GRYE sized bird though dumpier. Mostly black breast, yellowish legs, bi-colored bill, a little pale-whitish area at bill base; breast mostly black but some lighter feathers.
