- 2. Number of individuals, sexes, ages, general plumage (e.g., 2 in alternate plumage): One basic male. Bird seemed relatively large compared to nearby shorebirds (e.g., Greater and Lesser yellowlegs, Long-billed Dowitchers), so judged to be a male.

- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): 10 X 42 & 10 X 50 Leica binoculars in good condition, 20X zoom Kowa telescope also in good condition.
- 11. Distance to bird(s): 100 meters
- 12. Duration of observation: 1 hour

- 13. Habitat: Shallow flooded disked field in rice field area.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Feeding/resting in a mixed-species shorebird flock. Thousands of grackles also staging across the field.
- 15. From eBird: Male in non-breeding plumage; photos; superficially similar to Greater Yellowlegs in size and shape but somewhat chunkier and more compact with shorter, slightly drooped bill, scalloped back pattern, and brighter orangish legs. In with loafing flock of LBDO, and a few of both yellowlegs and Stilt Sandpipers for comparisons.
