The bird was perched near *Spartina patens* and *Phytolacca Americana* (pokeweed); the bright lemon yellow breast caught my eye, no vocalizations. It flew shortly after photographs were taken.

Kingbird with larger black bill, extensive bright yellow belly/breast with white throat and chin, gray crown with light black eye line. Did not have a dusky gray chest. Pale gray nape extending into grey/olive back. Flight feathers blackish with some whitish edging, and dark notched tail.
